Research Strategies Subcommittee: Modifications to Report

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Executive Summary Updates

- Add language to the Executive Summary describing the BES mission and the role of the program managers to make the report more specific to DOE.
- Emphasize the need for evaluating research investments including escalating costs of research and the urgency of making research investments.

Executive Summary Updates

- Update wording for two of the recommendations:
- Balance the funding portfolio across multiple axes—research versus facilities, single-investigator vs. group (Center or Hub) funding, established programs vs. emerging fields, and discovery based vs. use inspired research —to optimize impact of DOE research especially in times of constrained resources.
- Balance investment in and adoption of new assessment tools with more traditional online methods, e.g. publication and citation analysis, for making portfolio decisions, recognizing that AI/ML models are still in their infancy. Quantitative methods and expert opinion should be combined for optimal outcomes.

Updates to Main Text

- Regarding workforce development: add language about coordination with other funding agencies.
- Add upfront language to the case study to note the purpose was to illustrate what is possible using publicly available tools and information. A view of a topic or a technology (e.g. lithium ion batteries) is possible.
- Update references to include dates and other needed information.
- Copy editing as well as report formatting for final version.
