COV?

- •What?: A Panel to assess the efficacy and quality of the processes used to solicit, review, recommend, monitor, and document funding actions and to assess the quality of the resulting portfolio.
- •Who?: Each COV panel is composed of a group of recognized scientists and research program managers with broad expertise in the designated program areas.
- •When?: Every program element must be reviewed once every three years.
- •Why?: To insure quality, fairness, and help foster improvements.
- •Where?: A two- to three-day visit to DOE Germantown to review documents and meet with DOE program managers.

Past COVs

- Conducted three previous COVs in 2004, 2005, and 2006
- Covered entire Office of Fusion Energy Science (OFES) program in three separate reviews
- Were very positive
- Had a number of recommendations that OFES followed as much as feasible
- Did not get to national or international ranking

New Charge for COV

- Assess the efficacy and quality of the processes used by the OFES to solicit, review, recommend, monitor, and document awards and declinations for universities, national laboratories, and industry.
- Assess the breadth, depth, and quality of the resulting program portfolio, and provide an evaluation of the program's national and international standing.
- Report by April 2009.
